Chairman's report

As the Chairman of the Foundation, I have pleasure in introducing the Annual Report of the Trustees for the year to 5 April 2017.

Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014 (FRS102).

Structure, governance and management

Structure

The operation of the Foundation is governed by a Trust Deed dated 10 October 1958.

At 5 April 2017, the Foundation owned 79.2 percent of Wittington Investments Limited, a company registered in England. Wittington Investments is the ultimate holding company of Associated British Foods plc, which is listed on the London Stock Exchange, Fortnum and Mason plc and Heal's plc. Under the terms of the Trust Deed, the investment in the Wittington Investments Limited group of companies forms the permanent capital endowment of the Foundation and the Trustees may not dispose of those investments except by a unanimous vote of all the Trustees.

Governance and management

In accordance with the Trust Deed, after the death of Mr W Garfield Weston and his wife, their descendants became Trustees. The number of Trustees is limited to ten but must be at least five. If the number of Trustees drops below five, new Trustees fall to be appointed from amongst the lineal descendants of W Garfield Weston.

Being family members, incoming Trustees are aware of the aims and objectives of the Foundation and the manner in which the Trustees carry out their responsibilities. Nearly all of the Trustees are on the board of other charitable entities either in the UK, the United States or Canada. The Foundation is a member of the Foundations Forum and the Association of Charitable Foundations and also receives the main charities' journals. This ensures that the Trustees are well placed to keep up to date with developments in charity practice and regulations. In addition, the Trustees receive direct information in relation to important areas from both their Secretary, who attends monthly meetings and is a practising lawyer with expertise in the charity field, and from their auditors UHY Hacker Young LLP.

The Trustees are directly responsible for the management of the Foundation and hold regular meetings in order to consider grant applications for £100,000 or more and to ratify smaller grants which have been made since their previous meeting. While the initial processing of grant applications is dealt with by an experienced (but small) team of staff, every application is seen by at least one of the Trustees who also actively participate in meetings with and visits to applicants. The Trustees also hold an annual meeting in order to adopt the Annual Report and Accounts and to carry out a formal review of the fulfilment of the Charity's aims and objectives, policies and the investment performance over the year.

Risk management

The Trustees are satisfied that appropriate policies, protection, systems and checks remain in place in order to mitigate exposure to major risks and to ensure that the Foundation operates in accordance with ethical and environmental guidelines and protections. The Director and Secretary review operational risks and policies on an ongoing basis and these are formally considered by the Trustees at their Annual Meeting.

The principal risks relate to investment performance and operational risks in terms of grant-making arising from system malfunctions or fraudulent applications. There is also a reputational risk for the charity in terms of its relationship with the underlying trading activities of companies held through Wittington Investments Limited and the ABF group.

Operational: The computer system and internal procedures are regularly updated and reviewed and all grant applicants are screened by a skilled grants administration team which has been expanded in line with the increase in donations.

Investments: The Trustees regularly review the performance of the underlying assets and their shareholding in the Wittington Investments Limited group and receive reports directly from those who are managing the businesses. The non-Wittington investments are also managed in accordance with a policy which balances risk with investment returns (see below).

Reputation: The direct involvement of members of the Trustee board in the activities of the Wittington group also enables them to be fully apprised of events which might give rise to unwelcome media attention and hence reputational risks.

Conflicts of interest: The Trustees have in place a detailed policy regarding conflicts of interest both in terms of their grant-making decisions, and also in terms of the fact that some of them are both trustees and directors of Wittington group companies; this potential for conflict is carefully managed with proper procedures and the taking of independent advice where necessary.

Ethical and environment: As well as implementing their own policies to protect the environment (for example, nearly all applications are now made on-line and the Trustees receive meeting papers electronically, thus reducing the need for paper and printing), the Trustees also keep under scrutiny the ethical and environmental practices as carried out by the underlying businesses in the Wittington group. The Foundation does not employ its own staff but, in relation to its secondees, adheres to the practices laid down by Wittington and Associated British Foods in connection with the Modern Slavery Act and corporate responsibility - for more details see www.abf.co.uk/modern_slavery_statement and www.abf.co.uk/responsibility.

Income and grant-making aims and objectives

The Trust Deed contains broad charitable objects which allow the Trustees, in their discretion, to pay or apply the income and, subject to the restrictions set out below, the capital of the Trust Fund to or for the benefit of any charitable bodies, trusts, associations, institutions or organisations.

Total income receipts for the year were over £65.9 million (2016: £62.15 million). This has enabled the Trustees to increase their total grants to just over £62.75 million in support of 1,978 appeals (2016: £58.7 million in support of 1,617 appeals). Out of the total grants figure, just over £5.3 million represents pledges made in the current year; these ensure that funds are used effectively when required and, in some cases, are designed to provide matched-funding to give an incentive to other donors. The total outstanding forward commitments at the end of the financial year were just under £10.6 million, which is well within the Trustees' aim that pledges should not exceed 20% of their annual projected income, and the Trustees have ample income resources to meet these as they are called upon.

The grants made, as in previous years, support a wide range of charitable activities with a broad geographical spread across the UK. The trend towards supporting Community, Welfare and Youth projects has continued, including key £1 million grants to Auckland Castle towards an apprenticeship scheme and the Prince's Trust for a new youth centre in Birmingham and £600,000 to the Prisoners' Education Trust, as well as outreach to the most disadvantaged areas by a further extension of the Weston Charity Awards.

The Trustees have also, in conjunction with the Art Fund, initiated and provided initial funding for the Weston Loans Programme which is aimed at facilitating the borrowing by regional museums of key works of art from larger institutions.

Grant-making policy

The Foundation continues to accept only appeals from UK registered charities. No applications from individuals are considered and the Trustees do not typically fund projects outside the UK, nor do they fund animal welfare charities.

The Trustees' aim is to keep the application process as simple and streamlined as possible. Step by step guidelines as to how to make a grant application (which should ideally be submitted online, although the alternative of making a postal application is still available), together with helpful details of the criteria which are taken into consideration when assessing applications and the information which should be submitted with an application are available on the Foundation's website (www.garfieldweston.org). All applications are considered on an individual basis, but the Trustees will not consider any funding request made within 12 months of the outcome of a previous application. Whenever it is considered necessary or desirable, visits are made by Trustees and/or the Director or one of the other members of the Foundation's grants team in order to gain a better understanding of applicants' requirements. Regular contact is maintained with recipients of grants for monitoring purposes, while at the same time minimising disruption to the recipient charity's activities.

Public benefit

The Trustees have complied with section 2(1)(b) of the Charities Act 2011, having due regard for the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's aims and objectives, when setting the grant-making policy and in making awards.

Achievements and performance

The Trustees continue to increase levels of donations on a year by year basis whilst maintaining adequate income reserves. This is facilitated by a steady increase in dividends received from their investment in the Wittington group of companies which forms the Foundation's endowment.

Investment performance

As at 5 April 2017 the Trustees' portfolio with Investec was valued at nearly £58.1 million (2016: £49.9 million) which equates to an annual return net of fees of 20%. The WM Charities Index which the Trustees have previously used as a performance comparison no longer exists, and comparison has therefore been made with the net return on the ARC (Asset Risk Consultants) Charity Steady Growth Index, which to 31 March 2017 was 15.7%. The net cumulative three year return on the Investec portfolio was 27.3% as against the benchmark of RPI plus 4% over a rolling three year period (19%).

The Unigestion portfolio was valued on 5 April 2017 at £38.5 million (2016: £36.44 million) and performed well below both benchmarks.

The two portfolios are intended to provide complementary investment strategies which balance a reasonable return against protection from downside risk. The Unigestion portfolio has not been meeting this objective and the Trustees are (with advice from professional investment consultants, Bfinance) in the process of finding a new manager for this portfolio which can provide the same level of risk protection but better overall performance and fee levels.

The capital value of the Savills' Charities Property Fund has remained fairly static at £5.76 million (2016: £5.73 million).

As mentioned above, the Foundation's principal investment in the Wittington Group has once again maintained a steady performance during a volatile investment climate and dividend levels have increased. The Trustees receive a report on an annual basis which includes a detailed consideration of the underlying activities of Associated British Foods, Fortnum & Mason and Heal's. Changes in the valuation of Associated British Foods are due to share price fluctuations as a result of market conditions and do not affect the dividend or the underlying profitability of the investment. Further analysis of the investment assets can be found in Note 8 to the Financial Statements. A copy of Wittington Investments Limited's accounts for the year to 17 September 2016 can be obtained from the Foundation's principal office.

Financial review

In accordance with required accounting policy, grants are recognised in the statement of financial activities when approved by the Trustees and communicated to the recipients, irrespective of the future period over which payments are to be made, and the obligations outstanding at the year end are recognised as creditors.

Costs

There has been a further reduction in accounting and computing and IT costs from the previous year owing to in-house efficiencies, although staff costs are higher owing to a small increase in the team to assist with additional activities to facilitate grant applications.

Reserves

The Trustees' policy is to maintain reserves of approximately 50 per cent of the Foundation's annual income bearing in mind the general timing of income receipts, their general pattern of giving and the current economic climate. This target has been met in the current year and the appropriate reserve levels going forwards will be kept under review.

Investment objectives

The Trustees' investment objectives in relation to their non-Wittington group assets as set out in the policy statement are to preserve the absolute value of the capital, whilst maintaining its 'real' value. The managers are instructed to adopt a relatively conservative investment strategy investing in a balanced portfolio without geographical, currency or sector restriction, subject to the terms of a Charity Commission Order dated 19 September 2001. The primary benchmark for investment performance remains at RPI plus 4% over a rolling three year period, although comparison has also been made on an annual basis with the WM index for charities. The Trustees are aware that the ARC index, which is based on the portfolios of much smaller charities, is not an ideal replacement for the WM Index for Charities and are working with Investec to find a more suitable alternative annual comparison.

Given the relatively small size of the independently managed portfolios as compared with the Foundations' overall assets, the Trustees have chosen not to adopt a specific ethical investment policy. However, as mentioned above, the Trustees' principal investment, namely Associated British Foods, is a highly diversified global business with an extensive and practical approach to responsible business. The Trustees have a direct line of sight into this business, making the Foundation's approach to responsible investment more transparent and with a higher degree of clarity than other models might afford.

Trustees' responsibilities for the financial statements

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and breaches of law and regulations.

The Trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the charity and financial information included on the charity's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Plans for future periods

As the Trustees look forward to the 60th anniversary of the Foundation in October 2018, their continuing priority is to support a broad range of charitable causes without any sector restrictions or 'quotas' and also to ensure that funding reaches those recipients who are most deserving and who can make the most impact.

The Trustees are nevertheless conscious that, although their income and capacity to give away more has increased, the numbers of applications remain fairly static and the Trustees are exploring options as to how to ensure that their grants provide the optimum public benefit.

Director's Report

I am delighted to report that 2016/17 was a record year with over £62.7 million granted to nearly 2,000 charities across the UK.

The Trustees remain focused on helping charities that demonstrate they are meeting need effectively with clear outcomes and benefits, good leadership and a commitment to excellence. The Foundation's consistently flexible approach is particularly relevant in the current economic and political climate with its inherent uncertainties - this flexibility is a deliberate strategy on the part of the Trustees as it enables them to respond swiftly and decisively to changing trends and issues while also maintaining consistency across other areas of our work.

The Foundation's annual expenditure grew by 7% this year and it is especially pleasing that our grants under £100,000 increased significantly on last year - typically these grants are made to small to medium sized front-line charities that make a real difference to their local communities. In addition, successfully reversing a slight decline in the total number of applications the Foundation has received over the past four years, we are particularly pleased to note that our proactive work in the North of England and across categories such as Welfare and Youth is now bearing fruit. We plan to maintain this activity to ensure that we continue to meet need where it is most acute, especially at a time when unrestricted and core funding becomes ever more important.

Similar to other national funders, in recent years the Foundation has struggled to attract applications from Wales. In 2015/16 we commissioned research into the voluntary sector in Wales to understand the key issues in the region as input to Trustees' decision making and Foundation activities. The results caused us to initiate a programme of awareness raising across Wales and to develop partnerships with other grant-makers, whilst the Trustees also awarded grants to help charities access training and capability building opportunities. We will continue to monitor this and, although it is early days, there are some encouraging signs - we received 32% more applications from Wales this year and were able to donate more in funding as a result. Our challenge will be to maintain this growth not only in Wales but also in other areas where need is evident and a similarly strategic approach would be beneficial.

Funding is only one element of what our grantees tell us they need and this is especially the case outside London where resources can be harder to access. This year we have worked with a carefully selected number of organisations with programmes that are proven to build capability and capacity in their charity participants. These targeted 'resilience grants' have supported training, advice and support to the voluntary sector in the North of England, Wales and the Midlands

through organisations such as the Cranfield Trust, Small Charities Coalition and the Association of Chairs to name a few. These grants also complement our Weston Charity Awards which we run in partnership with Pilotlight. These Awards offer intense mentoring and business coaching to small charities working in the fields of Youth, Community and Welfare. Initially established in 2014 the Trustees recognised the importance of the Awards and extended them across the North and then further again to the Midlands this year. The following section shares a little more about the current Weston Charity Award holders, their work and aspirations.

We are excited that 2018 will mark the 60th anniversary of the Garfield Weston Foundation and we will be launching a series of events, publications, partnerships and special awards to celebrate the thousands of amazing charities that the Foundation has supported throughout its history.

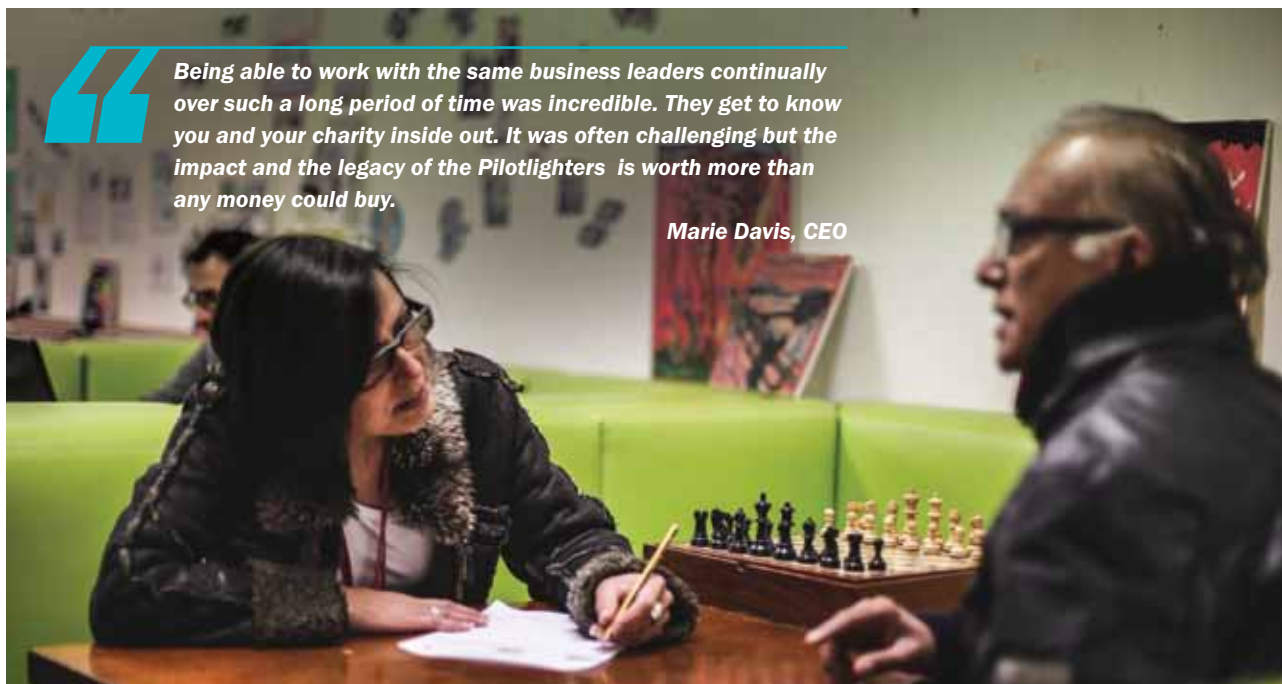
Disability Action Yorkshire

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2017

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved following Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn. The Trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102.

The particular accounting policies adopted by the Trustees are described below:

a Investments

Investments are stated at valuation at the balance sheet date as follows:

- at the Trustees' valuation of the unquoted equity investments as explained in note 8.
- at the market value of the managed portfolios as advised by the fund managers.

b Incoming resources

Dividends are included when received. Interest receivable on fixed interest securities and bank deposits is included on an accruals basis. All incoming resources are recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the resources, it is probable that the resources will be received and the monetary value of incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability.

c Resources expended and irrecoverable VAT

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the Charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Grants awarded are charged in the year when formally awarded by the Trustees and communicated to the recipient irrespective of the period covered by the donation as they are regarded by the Trustees as financial obligations.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.

d Allocation of overhead and support costs

Overhead and support costs are allocated first between charitable activity and governance. Overhead and support costs relating to charitable activities have been apportioned based on the value of individual grant awards made as it is considered that more is spent awarding, monitoring and assessing grants of greater value. The allocation of overhead and support costs is analysed in note 5.

e Costs of generating funds

The costs of generating funds consist of investment management fees and commissions.

f Charitable activities

Costs of charitable activities include grants made and an apportionment of overhead and support costs as shown in notes 3 and 4.

g Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the Charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to statutory audit and legal fees together with an apportionment of overhead and support costs.

h Interest in Wittington Investments Limited

At 5 April 2017 the Foundation owned 79.2% (2016: 79.2%) of Wittington Investments Limited, a company registered in England. Wittington Investments Limited is the ultimate holding company of Associated British Foods plc, and a wide range of investments including Fortnum & Mason plc and Heal's plc. Associated British Foods is listed on the London Stock Exchange whereas Fortnum & Mason and Heal's are unlisted subsidiary undertakings. The Foundation receives its income from Wittington Investments Limited by way of dividends and records its investment in that company at Trustees' valuation.

As the activities of Wittington Investments Limited and its subsidiaries are fundamentally different from the activities of the Foundation, consolidated accounts have not been prepared as the Trustees are of the opinion that the adopted policy gives a true and fair view of the Foundation's assets and sources of income. Details of the consolidated accounts of Wittington Investments Limited are shown in note 8 to these accounts. The Trustees have agreed this policy with the Charity Commission.

i Fixed assets investments

Investments are stated at market value as at the balance sheet date. The statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluation and disposals throughout the year.

j Realised gains and losses

All gains and losses are taken to the statement of financial activities as they arise. Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and opening market value. Unrealised gains and losses are calculated as the difference between the market value at the year end and opening market value. Realised and unrealised gains are not separated in the Statement of Financial Activities.

k Fund accounting

Details of the nature and purpose of each fund are set out in note 11.

The business of Wittington Investments Limited is the management of investments in a wide range of assets. As it is an unquoted company there is no readily identifiable market price for its shares. Accordingly, the value of the Foundation's investments has been assessed by the Trustees on the basis of the share of the value of the underlying net assets of Wittington attributable to the Foundation's holding.

Wittington's principal asset is a holding of 54.5% of the issued ordinary capital of Associated British Foods plc ('ABF') which is listed on The London Stock Exchange. In assessing the value of the underlying net assets of Wittington the value of its investment in ABF has been based on the mid-market price as at 5 April 2017. In arriving at this valuation no regard has been paid to the percentage controlling interest held by the Foundation.

In addition, Wittington holds a wide range of other assets managed in five different business segments:

- *Other Retail*, comprising the 100% ownership of Fortnum & Mason and Heal's, two long established retailers,
- *Real Estate*, investing in high-quality investment properties in the retail, office and distribution sectors across the UK. It also takes strategic positions in selective development opportunities, alongside local partners or sector specialists.
- *Hotels*. Wittington currently owns The Grand, Brighton and Richmond Hill Hotel.
- *Private Equity*, investing both directly and via externally managed funds in private equity, and
- *Other Investments* are principally composed of liquid investments in short-dated investment grade bonds and listed equities.

The value of these has been based on the Trustees' valuation at 5 April 2017. The Trustees have no current intention of disposing of the interest in Wittington.

Permanent endowment

The permanent endowment funds comprise the original capital fund, and gains thereto, established to provide income for grant payments in accordance with the objectives of the Foundation. The capital may not be converted into income. The funds are represented by the investments included in fixed assets. Unrealised gains on revaluation of these investments are credited to the funds.

Unrestricted expendable capital

In accordance with the authority given to the Trustees under an Order of the Charity Commission dated 19 September 2001, £65,747,000 was transferred to an expendable capital fund in relation to which income and capital are distributable at the discretion of the Trustees. £5 million was invested in 2001/02 in the Charities Property Fund and £60 million was invested in 2002/03 with investment managers in balanced portfolios on a discretionary total return basis. Income and investment gains and losses are taken to this fund and the amount allocated to income by the Trustees, £3,480,000 (2016: £3,349,000), is shown as a transfer to the income fund.

Unrestricted income funds

The income of the Foundation is expendable at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the objects of the Foundation. Gains on investments held in the income funds are credited to these funds.
